Tasting Note: AltaCima 6330 refers to the height of the Parinacota Volcano, part of the Chilean Andes, whose beauty inspires us to find the best terroir expression of our vineyard.

Our Alto Andes Sauvignon Blanc 2018 comes from grapes grown in the mountains close to the origins of the Lontué River. This unique microclimate, together with the minerality of its volcanic soil, creates an intense wine of great freshness and great body, with herbal, citrus and exotic notes reminiscent of passion fruit.
